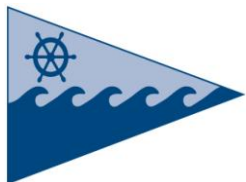

NOTICE OF RACE

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Organizing Authority of the Chuck Stein Random Leg Race is Pacific Mariners Yacht Club, Marina del Rey, CA (www.pmyc.org). Race management is provided by South Bay Yacht Racing Club (www.sbyrc.org). This race is part of the ASMBYC High Point Series.

1. RULES

- 1.1 This regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in "The Racing Rules of Sailing for 2017 - 2020"
- 1.2 Rule 55 will be modified to allow biodegradable sail stops to be discharged overboard when setting a sail
- 1.3 Rules 63.1, A4.1 and A5 will be changed so that a boat starting more than five (5) minutes after her Starting Signal will be scored DNS without a hearing.
- 1.4 Rule 63.7 will be replaced with: "If there is any conflict between a rule in the Notice of Race and one in the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions shall apply."
- 1.5 Rule 82 will not apply to this event.
- 1.6 Appendix T, Arbitration will apply.

2. ELIGIBILITY, ENTRY, and FEES

- 2.1. The regatta is open to PHRF, One-Design, Cruising class and ORCA class boats. Collectively PHRF and one-design are "Performance" boats, with one division for them. A second division for Cruising Class boats is provided. A third division is also provided for ORCA class boats. ORCA boats must have a current ORCA class certificate. Divisions may be created or consolidated by the race committee depending on the number of entrants and types of boats participating.
- 2.2. When registering for the regatta, racers shall enter their Area B Random-Leg rating.
- 2.3. Skippers must be members of a yacht club or sailing association affiliated with SCYA or US Sailing.
- 2.4. Entries will only be accepted online at www.regattanetwork.com. Entry fees must be paid at time of registration.
- 2.5. The entry fee is \$30. Entries are due by 1700 HRS on Friday, August 11, 2017.

3. SCHEDULE

3.1 Performance: One random-leg race scheduled. The first warning is scheduled for 1155.

3.2 Cruising: One random-leg race is scheduled. The first warning is scheduled for after the last Performance start.

3.3 ORCA: One random-leg race is scheduled. The first warning is scheduled for after the last Cruising start.

4. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND CLASSES

The Sailing Instructions and classes will be posted on www.RegattaNetwork.com website, by 1900 hours, August 11, 2017.

5. VENUE

5.1 The racing area will be the Santa Monica Bay outside the Marina del Rey breakwater. Courses will use the fixed marks of Marina del Rey as described in the ASMBYC Marina Del Rey Course Chart 17, plus additional marks as RC deems appropriate for the conditions. The starting area will be in the vicinity of S Mark.

5.2 Any missing fixed buoys will be replaced by orange or yellow inflatables at the approximate position(s) listed on Course Chart 17.

6. COURSES

6.1. Courses for Performance boats will use the ASMBYC Marina Del Rey Course Chart 17 and /or inflatable orange and yellow marks.

6.2. Courses for Cruisers will use the ASMBYC Marina Del Rey Course 17 and /or inflatable orange and yellow marks.

7. RADIO COMMUNICATION

While on the water the RC may communicate via VHF with the competing boats, including announcing starting penalties; frequencies will be given in the Sailing Instructions.

8. SCORING

8.1. PHRF boats will be scored using their Area B Random Leg rating

8.2. Cruising boats will be scored using their Standard or Certified ASMBYC Random Leg Course Cruiser Rating, or a rating calculated with the ASMBYC allowances. ASMBYC Cruiser ratings are available at www.asmbyc.org/cruising-class-racing/. Ratings take a minimum of 3 business days to process and if this would preclude entering the regatta the RC assist competitors with rating calculations.

8.3. No race score will be excluded. This changes rule A2

9. PENALTIES

9.1. Rule 44.1 is changed so that a boat may exonerate herself by taking a one-turn penalty. Exceptions (a) and (b) to Rule 44.1 remain in force.

10. HOSPITALITY

Saturday's post-race hospitality and trophy presentation will be held at Pacific Mariners Yacht Club: 13915 Panay Way, Marina Del Rey, CA.

11. TROPHIES

Trophies will be presented to the winners of their respective divisions: The Chuck Stein Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the Performance class winner.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage and injury. Competitors in this event are participating entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this event. By participating in this event, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
